Based on your knowledge and experience regarding high-need schools and classrooms, imagine that you are in your first year of teaching at such a school. Talk about what a productive day would look like and what a challenging day would look like. Explain what is happening with the students, with you (the teacher), and/or with others in the classroom or school setting to make it a productive or challenging day. Reflect on your reasons for defining your day and actions you might have taken to improve the outcome. An impacting essay will avoid simple stereotypes and will demonstrate your understanding of some of the underlying issues that affect teaching and learning in high-need classrooms.

Please describe the aspects of your pre-professional knowledge, personal character and/or special talents that will make you suitable to undertake an extended commitment required of Noyce educators to be placed in low performing, high-need scholastic environments.
